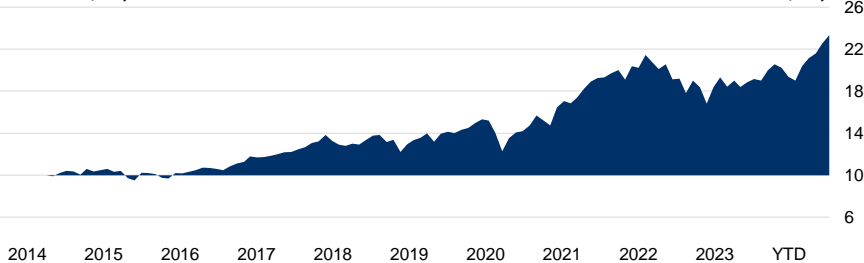

100% S&P 500 Total Return Index (US\$)

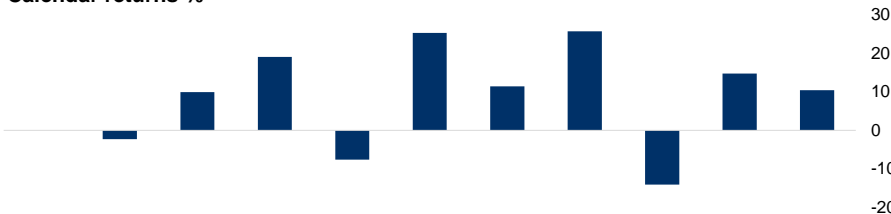
