MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to provide long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of companies located or active in emerging markets, but excludes securities of issuers directly engaged in the extraction, processing and transportation of fossil fuels such as coal, oil and natural gas.

The Fund's investment process begins by excluding issuers identified in two exclusion lists that determine its investable universe. The Fund applies the two exclusion lists concurrently. The Fund may from time to time depart from its exclusion lists when RBC GAM has determined that it would be in the best interest of the Fund to do so.

The first exclusion list is based on the Carbon Underground 200, which identifies the top 100 public coal companies globally and the top 100 public oil and gas companies globally, ranked by the potential carbon emissions content of their reported reserves. The Carbon Underground 200 list is maintained by Fossil Free Indexes LLC, and is revised quarterly.

With respect to the second exclusion list, Sustainalytics determines and excludes companies that directly, or indirectly through a significant stake in a subsidiary, derive any revenues from or are involved in the (i) exploration and extraction of Arctic oil and gas, (ii) exploration, production, refining, transportation and/or storage of oil and natural gas, (iii) extraction of oil sands, shale energy and/or thermal coal, and/or (iv) provision of storage, transportation, mining and refining services of thermal coal. The Fund also excludes companies that directly, or indirectly through a significant stake in a subsidiary, derive 10% or more of their revenues from the provision of tailor-made products and services that support oil and gas exploration, production, refining, transportation and/or storage, or from power generated by thermal coal, as determined by Sustainalytics.

On a monthly basis, Sustainalytics provides RBC GAM with a list of ineligible issuers based on the Fund's exclusion criteria. Sustainalytics periodically monitors the Fund's holdings against the exclusion criteria.

RBC GAM then applies its multi-disciplined investment process to select securities for the Fund. This includes the incorporation of environmental, social and governance ("ESG") factors to the extent that an issuer's management and exposure to such ESG factors are material to the risk-adjusted long-term performance of the security and/or the Fund.

Risk

There were no significant changes to the investment objective and strategies that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the Fund and the suitability of the Fund for investors remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value rose to \$205 million as of December 31, 2025, from \$153 million at the end of 2024. The increase was due to investment returns.

Over the past year, the Fund's Series F units gained 28.4%, which outperformed the 28.3% rise in the benchmark. The broad-based index rose 27.3%. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while benchmark and broad-based index returns do not include any costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

Emerging-market stocks recorded significant gains in 2025, outperforming developed markets for the first time in five years as the U.S. dollar weakened and Chinese equities rebounded from their mostly poor relative performance since the pandemic. Investors in emerging markets were also able, for the time being, to sidestep some of the negative impact of U.S. President Donald Trump's punitive tariffs as emerging markets, especially China, had success expanding trade relationships outside developed markets. Emerging markets' increasing exposure to the technology sectors bolstered performance, as they have been responsible for most of the stock market's significant gains in recent years, and currency strength was a big contributor to returns as the U.S. dollar declined.

Strong stock selection was the primary driver of relative performance, with returns aided by choices in the Financials and Information Technology sectors. An overweight allocation to the Consumer Staples sector hurt relative performance, while the absence of exposure to Energy provided the largest positive contribution. At the country level, a complete lack of exposure to Saudi Arabia benefited relative returns, as did stock selection in South Korea.

The positions that contributed the most to relative returns over the period were SK Hynix, Antofagasta, Delta Electronics, Shinhan Financial Group and Samsung Fire & Marine Insurance. The positions that hurt returns the most were Tata Consultancy Services, SM Investments, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, HDFC Bank and Voltronic Power Technology.



Sustainalytics conducted reviews covering the Fund's holdings in 2025. In the opinion of Sustainalytics and RBC GAM, all holdings in the Fund were eligible at the time of review based on the Fund's ESG exclusion criteria. During 2025, no holdings were removed from the Fund for failing to meet the ESG exclusion criteria.

Recent Developments

The challenges faced by emerging-market equities appear to be receding somewhat. China's performance has improved and is supporting overall emerging-market returns, and the sub-advisor believes emerging-market strength is poised to continue amid economic reforms and a recovery in domestic consumption.

U.S.-dollar weakness is another element that tends to favour emerging-market stocks, and the U.S. dollar's decline this year versus emerging-market currencies may signal the start of a longer-term trend.

Emerging-market equities are benefiting from broad shifts in portfolio exposure in terms of sector and stock selection. Technology and consumer stocks make up a greater share of emerging markets, enabling investors to diversify beyond traditional avenues such as natural resources. Moreover, emerging-market valuations remain attractive based on measures such as book value.

Effective January 1, 2026, Brenda Eaton was appointed as Chair of the Independent Review Committee (the "IRC") following the retirement of Suromitra Sanatani, who has served as a dedicated member of the IRC since 2017. Effective January 1, 2026, Geoffrey D. Creighton was appointed as a new member of the IRC.

Related-Party Transactions

Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Manager

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada ("Royal Bank") and is the manager, trustee and portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund's day-to-day operations, holds title to the Fund's property on behalf of its unitholders, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM, which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. RBC GAM, as trustee, earns a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign

exchange spread when unitholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.

Sub-Advisor

RBC Global Asset Management (UK) Limited is the sub-advisor and provides investment advice for the Fund. The sub-advisor earns a fee which is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. The sub-advisor is paid by the manager from the management fee paid by the Fund.

Distributors

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of units of, the Fund. Dealers may receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of units of the Fund.

Registrars

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns units of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Custodian

RBC IS is the custodian and holds the assets of the Fund. RBC IS earns a fee as the custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Securities Lending Agent

To the extent the Fund may engage in securities lending transactions, RBC IS may act as the Fund's securities lending agent. Any revenue earned on such securities lending is split between the Fund and the securities lending agent.



Other Related-Party Transactions

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

Related-Party Trading Activities

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity, debt securities or mortgages from or sales of equity, debt securities or mortgages to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

Inter-Fund Trading

- (d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the direct expenses charged to the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of the expenses of underlying funds, if any, for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

² The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not applicable to money market funds.

Effective July 1, 2023, the administration fees for Series O units were reduced to 0.07% from 0.10%. If the changes to the administration fees would have been in effect throughout the financial year ended December 31, 2023, the adjusted MER for each series of the Fund would be: Series O – 0.08%.

Effective January 1, 2023, the administration fees for Series O units were reduced to 0.10% from 0.15%. If the changes to the administration fees would have been in effect throughout the financial year ended December 31, 2022, the adjusted MER for each series of the Fund would be: Series O – 0.11%.

Management Fees and Administration Fees

Management fees and administration fees of each series of the Fund are payable to RBC GAM and calculated at the following annual percentages, before GST/HST, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. The management fee, breakdown of services received in consideration of the management fee, as a percentage of the management fee, and the administration fee for each series are as follows:

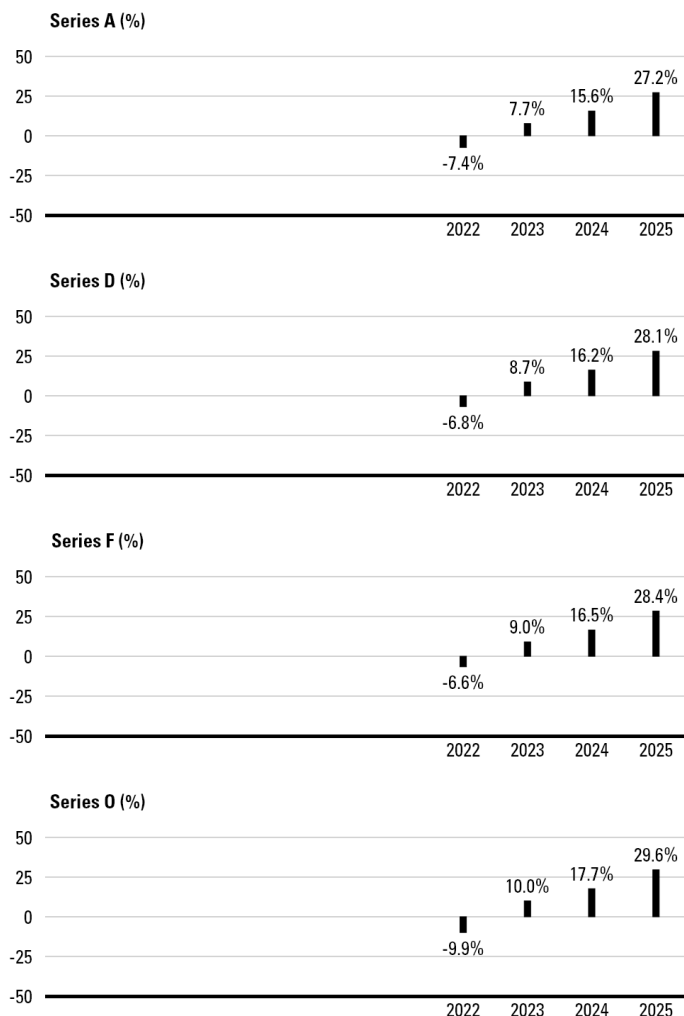
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PAST PERFORMANCE

INDEX DESCRIPTIONS

MSCI Emerging Markets ex-Fossil Fuel Total Return Net Index (CAD) The index is a broad performance measure of large- and mid-cap stocks in emerging markets, excluding companies that own oil, gas and coal reserves. It is a benchmark for investors who aim to eliminate investment exposure to fossil-fuel reserves due to concerns about their contribution to climate change.

MSCI Emerging Markets Total Return Net Index (CAD) This index is a broad measure of the Canadian-dollar performance of emerging-market equities. As of May 2010, the index consisted of the following 21 emerging-market country indexes: Brazil, Chile, China, Colombia, Czech Republic, Egypt, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Mexico, Morocco, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Russia, South Africa, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand and Turkey. The net total return index reinvests dividends after the deduction of withholding taxes, using (for international indexes) a tax rate applicable to non-resident institutional investors who do not benefit from double taxation treaties.
