## MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE (in USD)

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to achieve above-average long-term total returns by taking advantage of interest rate and currency fluctuations in world fixed-income markets. The Fund also seeks to provide total returns comprised of interest income and some capital growth. To achieve the Fund's objectives, it invests primarily in high-quality fixed-income securities, denominated in foreign currencies and issued internationally by governments and their agencies around the world.

### Risk

There were no significant changes to the investment objective and strategies that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the Fund and the suitability of the Fund for investors remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus.

### Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value fell to \$35 million as of December 31, 2023, from \$36 million at the end of 2022. The decrease was due to net redemptions, partially offset by investment returns.

Over the past year, the Fund's Series F units gained 6.0%, which underperformed the 6.4% rise in the benchmark. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while benchmark and broad-based index returns do not include any costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

Government fixed-income securities in developed markets delivered strong returns after a year-end rally led to the first annual gain for bonds since 2020. The plunge in bond yields, which move in the opposite direction of prices, came after major central banks signalled they were nearing the end of interest-rate hikes required to tame inflation. Bond yields touched multi-decade highs in October but retreated as both inflation and the economies outside the U.S. cooled. The U.S. 10-year yield ended 2023 at 3.87%, near where it started the year but traded in a 170-basis-point range between 3.30% and 5.02% – the highest since July 2007.

The U.S. Federal Reserve (the "Fed") raised short-term benchmark interest rates in smaller increments than it had in 2022 – a total of four to a range of 5.25% to 5.50%. The European Central Bank delivered six rate hikes, putting the policy rate at 4.5% to head off inflation, even as its largest economy, Germany, descended into a recession. In the UK, the Bank of England's policy rate rose to 5.25% amid persistent demands for higher wages and widespread

labour disruptions, with the most recent increase coming in August. The Bank of Japan remained an outlier by holding rates at ultra-low levels.

The Fund's relative performance was aided by positions that benefited from falling interest rates. An overweight position in longer-maturity bonds in Europe, the UK and Brazil more than offset losses tied to a lack of exposure to Japan and China. Returns were also bolstered by exposure to high-quality, short-dated corporate bonds and emerging-market debt given the extra income and modest capital gains that they offered relative to government securities. These bonds performed well as U.S. economic growth stayed strong.

### Recent Developments

Consumer spending, business investment and global trade are starting to feel the pinch of higher interest rates and may deteriorate further. As a result, the portfolio manager expects most major central banks to start easing policy rates in 2024, although by the end of 2023, the Fed was the only major central bank to have hinted at easing. In such an environment, the portfolio manager is favouring assets that would gain if interest rates extend their declines.

Should the economic outlook worsen as the portfolio manager expects, corporate bonds would underperform comparable government securities, and the extra yield offered by corporate bonds would increase. Such a scenario would give the Fund an opportunity to accumulate corporate bonds from the relatively low allocations currently in the portfolio.

Over the longer term, bond yields may stay higher as the U.S. government will have to increase bond issuance to fund expanded social spending. Yields could also be supported by persistent inflation, which would force the Fed to hold policy rates at levels that might limit economic growth.

Effective January 1, 2023, Suromitra Sanatani was appointed as Chair of the Independent Review Committee ("the IRC"). Effective February 1, 2023, Joanne Vézina was appointed as a member of the IRC. Effective March 1, 2023, Enrique Cuyegkeng was appointed as a member of the IRC.

### Related-Party Transactions

#### *Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Manager*

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada ("Royal Bank") and is the manager, trustee and portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund's day-to-day operations, holds title to the Fund's property on behalf of its unitholders, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM,



which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. RBC GAM, as trustee, earns a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when unitholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.

#### **Sub-Advisor**

RBC Global Asset Management (UK) Limited is the sub-advisor and provides investment advice for the Fund. The sub-advisor earns a fee which is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. The sub-advisor is paid by the manager from the management fee paid by the Fund.

#### **Distributors**

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of units of, the Fund. Dealers may receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of units of the Fund.

#### **Registrars**

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns units of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

#### **Custodian**

RBC IS is the custodian and holds the assets of the Fund. RBC IS earns a fee as the custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

#### **Securities Lending Agent**

To the extent the Fund may engage in securities lending transactions, RBC IS may act as the Fund's securities lending agent. Any revenue earned on such securities lending is split between the Fund and the securities lending agent.

#### **Brokers and Dealers**

The Fund has established standard brokerage and dealing agreements at market rates with related parties. For the periods ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, the related-party commissions were \$1,000 (2022 – \$1,000) or 100% (2022 – 50%) of the total transaction costs paid for this Fund.

#### **Other Related-Party Transactions**

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

#### **Related-Party Trading Activities**

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity, debt securities or mortgages from or sales of equity, debt securities or mortgages to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

#### **Inter-Fund Trading**

- (d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

<sup>2</sup> The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not applicable to money market funds.

<sup>3</sup> The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of such costs of underlying funds expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.
