MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The ETF seeks to replicate, to the extent possible and before fees and expenses, the performance of a broad Canadian equity markets index with a focus on companies domiciled in Canada that have demonstrated commitment to gender diversity as part of their corporate social responsibility strategy. Currently, the ETF seeks to track the MSCI Canada IMI Women's Leadership Select Index (or any successor thereto). The investment strategy of the ETF is to invest in and hold the constituent securities of the MSCI Canada IMI Women's Leadership Select Index in substantially the same proportion as they are reflected in the index or securities intended to replicate the performance of the index.

Risk

There were no significant changes to the ETF that materially affected the ETF's overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the ETF and the suitability of the ETF for investors remain as discussed in the Prospectus.

Results of Operations

The ETF's net asset value fell to \$13 million as of September 30, 2022, from \$14 million on September 30, 2021. The decrease was due to a combination of net redemptions and investment losses.

Over the past financial year, the ETF's units lost 5.6%, which underperformed the 5.3% decline in the benchmark. The ETF's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while benchmark and broad-based index returns do not include any costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of the ETF.

Canadian stocks declined during the period, after having touched all-time highs in early 2022. Stocks backtracked on concern that elevated inflation and rising interest rates would slow economic growth and perhaps lead to a global recession. Even so, the Canadian equity market was the best-performing major stock index during the period, thanks to surging prices for energy and other commodities.

Most sectors recorded losses during the period. The Energy, Materials and Consumer Staples sectors performed best, while Health Care and Information Technology lagged. Interest-rate-sensitive sectors such as Financials and Consumer Discretionary also underperformed as much higher domestic bond yields, the key determiner of consumer-borrowing costs, rose to their highest levels since the 2008 financial crisis.

Recent Developments

While inflation and fears of recession have worsened the macroeconomic backdrop, investor expectations for corporate profits remain resilient in the short term. Aggregate earnings for the companies in the Canadian benchmark stock index are forecast to rise 20% in 2022 given higher energy prices and sustained consumption. However, the impact of elevated natural-resource prices, rising wages and the likelihood of slowing consumer demand are now being reflected in profit forecasts, and earnings growth in 2023 is expected to fall to 4%.

The consensus 2022 growth forecast for the Canadian economy is 3.5%, down from about 4.0% as recently as three months ago, and falling to 1.6% for 2023. However, economists expect Canada's economy to outpace the U.S., due to the positive impact of higher commodity prices. The past year's persistent inflation suggests the Bank of Canada will continue with interest-rate increases in order to cool consumer demand.

Effective September 20, 2022, Brenda Eaton was appointed as Vice Chair of the Independent Review Committee (the "IRC") following the death of Paul K. Bates, who had served as a dedicated member of the IRC since December 2014.

Related-Party Transactions

Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Manager

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada ("Royal Bank") and is the manager, trustee and portfolio manager of the ETF. RBC GAM is responsible for the ETF's day-to-day operations, holds title to the ETF's property on behalf of its unitholders, and provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the ETF. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the ETF as compensation for its services. The management fee is calculated and accrued on a daily basis and is based on a percentage of the net asset value of the ETF.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the ETF, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when unitholders buy and sell ETF units denominated in different currencies. The ETF may also maintain bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the ETF in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.



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Custodian and Valuation Agent

RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") is the custodian and valuation agent and holds the assets of the ETF and provides administrative services to the ETF. RBC IS earns a fee for these services, which is paid by the manager from the management fee paid by the ETF.

Designated Broker

RBC GAM has entered into an agreement with RBC Dominion Securities Inc., an affiliate of RBC GAM, to act as designated broker and/or authorized dealer for the distribution of units of the ETF, on terms and conditions that are comparable to arm's length agreements in the ETF industry. The material terms and conditions of the agreement have been disclosed in the ETF's Prospectus.

Securities Lending Agent

To the extent the ETF may engage in securities lending transactions, RBC IS may act as the ETF's securities lending agent. Any revenue earned on such securities lending is split between the ETF and the securities lending agent.

Brokers and Dealers

The ETF has established standard brokerage and dealing agreements at market rates with related parties. For the periods ended September 30, 2022 and 2021, the related-party commissions were \$2,000 (2021 – \$20,000) or 67% (2021 – 100%) of the total transaction costs paid for this ETF.

Other Related-Party Transactions

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the ETF relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

Related-Party Trading Activities

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of debt securities from or sales of debt securities to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates,

- (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the ETF, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the ETF.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the direct expenses charged to the ETF and the ETF's proportionate share of the expenses of underlying funds, if any, for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

² The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the ETF and the ETF's proportionate share of such costs of underlying funds expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

³ The ETF's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the ETF.


