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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to achieve long-term total returns consisting of regular dividend income, which benefits from the preferential tax treatment given to dividends from Canadian companies, and modest long-term capital growth.

To achieve its investment objective, the Fund invests most of its assets in the RBC Private Canadian Dividend Pool and/or the RBC Canadian Dividend Fund (the “underlying funds”). The underlying funds invest primarily in common shares with above-average dividend yields and also invest in preferred shares of major Canadian companies. The underlying funds select companies with prospects of paying or growing their dividends and tend to focus on interest-sensitive securities to achieve dividend income, primarily investing in the Financials, Communication Services and Utilities sectors.

Results of Operations

The Fund’s net asset value was \$140 million as of September 30, 2021.

Over the past six months, the Fund’s Series A shares gained 9.0%. The Fund’s return is after the deduction of fees and expenses. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

The Canadian stock market extended gains over the six-month period, with the S&P/TSX Composite Index reaching an all-time high in early September. The equity gains were driven largely by continued optimism about the progress of COVID-19 vaccinations in much of the developed world, fuelling economic growth and corporate earnings, and boosting commodity prices. Canada’s stock market benefited from the higher commodity prices as commodity-linked businesses account for almost one-quarter of the S&P/TSX’s market capitalization. Information Technology was Canada’s best-performing sector, supported by expectations that growing demand for technology will remain strong beyond the pandemic. Energy ranked second in performance among S&P/TSX sectors.

The Fund’s relative performance was aided by underweight allocations to the Materials and Consumer Discretionary sectors, as well as security selection in the Financials sector. An overweight position in Power Corp. boosted returns given the stock’s attractive valuation and strong results across its subsidiaries. Similarly, an overweight allocation to Brookfield Asset Management added to relative performance. The company has an attractive valuation and plans to expand in the areas of insurance, lending and technology.

Security selection in the Industrials and Real Estate sectors held back the Fund’s relative performance. Returns were limited by an overweight position in Canadian Pacific Railway, which faced criticism that it agreed to pay too much to acquire Kansas City Southern and took on too much debt to do so. There was also uncertainty regarding whether the deal would go through. Returns were also negatively affected by an underweight in the Information Technology sector. Shares of Constellation Software performed well as the company executed on its acquisition strategy.

Recent Developments

The portfolio manager expects economic momentum to continue into 2022, albeit at a slower pace than originally expected due to the coronavirus’s Delta variant, and robust growth should support the outlook for corporate profits. As the recovery progresses, the portfolio manager believes that earnings growth will be driven by economically sensitive sectors including Industrials, Energy and Consumer Discretionary.

There are, however, a number of risks to this outlook, including inflation. Persistent or accelerating inflation could prompt the Bank of Canada to remove monetary stimulus sooner than anticipated, and such action could, in the view of the portfolio manager, call into question the recovery in profits and limit equity returns.

Effective April 1, 2021, Ms. Brenda Eaton was appointed as a member of the Independent Review Committee.

Related-Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Manager

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada (“Royal Bank”) and is the manager and portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund’s day-to-day operations, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM, which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of mutual fund shares of the Fund.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when shareholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank



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for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.

Distributors

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of the mutual fund shares of, the Fund. Dealers receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of mutual fund shares of the Fund.

Registrars

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns mutual fund shares of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Custodian

RBC IS is the custodian and holds the assets of the Fund. RBC IS earns a fee as the custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Other Related-Party Transactions

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

Related-Party Trading Activities

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity and debt securities from or sales of equity or debt securities to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

Inter-Fund Trading

- (d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the direct expenses charged to the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of the expenses of underlying funds, if any, for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to shareholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

² The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund.

³ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

Effective June 30, 2016, the management fees for Series D mutual fund shares were reduced to 0.85% from 1.00%; and for Series F mutual fund shares were reduced to 0.60% from 0.75%. If the changes to the management fees would have been in effect throughout the financial year ended March 31, 2017, the adjusted MER for each series of the Fund would be: Series D – 1.04% and Series F – 0.79%.

Management Fees and Administration Fees

Management fees and administration fees of each series of the Fund are payable to RBC GAM and calculated at the following annual percentages, before GST/HST, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. 



