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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to provide long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of a diversified mix of companies operating around the world and across a range of sectors.

To achieve its investment objective, the Fund invests most of its assets in the RBC Global Equity Fund (the "underlying fund"). The portfolio manager of the underlying fund uses primarily fundamental research to assess the economic outlook for regions around the world, including expected growth, market valuations and economic trends. The underlying fund may invest in American Depository Receipts and may invest as much as 10% of its assets in units of other funds managed by RBC GAM or an affiliate of RBC GAM.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value was \$64 million as of September 30, 2021.

Over the past six months, the Fund's Series A shares gained 9.1%. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

Global equity markets were more settled during the period than they were amid the significant volatility of early 2021, bolstered by the rapid success of vaccination programs, especially in Europe and North America, and significant U.S. fiscal stimulus. The performance of stocks that are most economically sensitive largely caught up with the larger-cap growth stocks that had dominated the initial stages of the pandemic, as confidence grew in the sustainability of the economic recovery.

The pick-up in economic activity put supply chains under pressure, creating labour and raw-material shortages that caused prices to rise. Although inflation concerns were initially dismissed as temporary, a recognition that they would last longer than initially anticipated led to weakening equity-market momentum at the end of the period. A significant number of announcements from the Chinese government relating to the regulation of technology companies also created a degree of financial-market uncertainty. However, a relative lack of direct exposure to these kinds of companies reduced the overall impact of Chinese investments on the Fund.

The portfolio benefited from positions in Blackstone, Alphabet and Danaher. Stocks that had a negative impact on relative returns included Ørsted, Anheuser-Busch InBev and Naspers.

Recent Developments

Faster-than-expected inflation is testing the consensus that the end of monetary stimulus will be delayed, creating expectations among some investors that major central banks will be forced to boost interest rates sooner than they would like. The hope for investors is that economic recovery enables corporate cash flows to improve sufficiently to at least offset the impact of potentially higher rates. Otherwise, the odds of financial-market volatility could rise.

The portfolio manager continues to believe that investors' interests will be best served by owning businesses with strong, sustainable earnings and healthy balance sheets. Such businesses are likely to effectively manage profit margins and capture opportunities arising from the changing business environment. The portfolio manager is therefore focused on constructing portfolios that combine the benefits of individual stock selection with efforts to minimize unintended volatility.

Effective September 15, 2021, the Fund was closed to new investors. Investors who held shares of the Fund on September 15, 2021 can continue to make additional investments in the Fund.

Effective April 1, 2021, Ms. Brenda Eaton was appointed as a member of the Independent Review Committee.

Related-Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Manager

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada ("Royal Bank") and is the manager and portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund's day-to-day operations, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM, which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of mutual fund shares of the Fund.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when shareholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.



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Distributors

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of the mutual fund shares of, the Fund. Dealers receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of mutual fund shares of the Fund.

Registrars

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns mutual fund shares of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Custodian

RBC IS is the custodian and holds the assets of the Fund. RBC IS earns a fee as the custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Other Related-Party Transactions

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

Related-Party Trading Activities

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity and debt securities from or sales of equity or debt securities to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

Inter-Fund Trading

- (d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the direct expenses charged to the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of the expenses of underlying funds, if any, for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to shareholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

² The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund.

³ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

Effective June 30, 2016, the management fees for Series A mutual fund shares were reduced to 1.75% from 1.85%; for Series D mutual fund shares were reduced to 1.00% from 1.10%; and for Series F mutual fund shares were reduced to 0.75% from 0.85%. If the changes to the management fees would have been in effect throughout the financial year ended March 31, 2017, the adjusted MER for each series of the Fund would be: Series A – 2.01%, Series D – 1.27% and Series F – 1.02%.

Management Fees and Administration Fees

Management fees and administration fees of each series of the Fund are payable to RBC GAM and calculated at the following annual percentages, before GST/HST, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. The management fee, breakdown of services received in consideration of the management fee, as a percentage of the management fee, and the administration fee for each series are as follows:



PAST PERFORMANCE



Year-by-Year Returns (%)




Series D (%)
