MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to provide total returns comprised of interest income and capital growth by investing primarily in government debt securities of emerging market countries, while minimizing the exposure to currency fluctuations between foreign currencies and the Canadian dollar.

The Fund invests up to 100% of its net assets in units of the RBC Emerging Markets Bond Fund (the “underlying funds”). The underlying fund invests mainly in U.S. dollar-denominated bonds issued by governments of emerging market countries. The underlying fund may also invest in bonds of these countries denominated in another G7 currency or in the local currencies of these countries. The Fund uses currency hedges to minimize the impact of fluctuations in foreign currencies versus the Canadian dollar.

Results of Operations

The Fund’s net asset value was \$941 million as of June 30, 2025.

Over the past six months, the Fund’s Series F units gained 4.3%. The Fund’s return is after the deduction of fees and expenses. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

Emerging-market government bonds performed strongly in the first half of 2025 as uncertainty about large proposed increases in U.S. tariffs gave way to optimism after U.S. President Trump appeared to adopt a more conciliatory approach to trade. Generally lower interest rates and signs of stabilization in China’s economy further bolstered support for emerging-market bonds. Chinese authorities reaffirmed their commitment to stimulate the economy and signalled additional measures to stabilize it, a move that should benefit other emerging markets. Meanwhile, subdued inflation across emerging markets allowed their central banks to continue cutting interest rates at a pace that enhanced economic growth, and expectations of further rate cuts by the U.S. Federal Reserve, coupled with a weaker U.S. dollar, helped reduce the value of the debt owed by emerging-market countries.

Riskier emerging-market bonds, such as those issued by Ecuador, Bolivia and Zambia, delivered strong gains, outperforming investment-grade issuers such as China, Malaysia and Indonesia. Political risks resurfaced in Turkey, where President Erdogan’s detention of opposition politicians and journalists weighed on Turkish assets. Geopolitical tensions also intensified, with the Russia–Ukraine war escalating and Israel and the U.S. bombing Iran’s nuclear facilities.

The Fund’s performance benefited from relatively high exposure to high-yielding issuers such as Egypt, Ghana and Ecuador, as well as its allocation to Pemex, Mexico’s state-owned oil company. Conversely, the Fund’s lack of exposure to defaulted Lebanese bonds, which rallied, hurt results as these bonds gained following the election of a new government. Also weighing on the Fund’s results was relatively low exposure to investment-grade issuers such as Saudi Arabia, Poland and Chile, whose bonds gained on falling interest rates.

Recent Developments

The portfolio manager has some concerns that valuations of emerging-market sovereign bonds are stretched given geopolitical tensions, setbacks in U.S.–China relations and slower-than-expected growth in key economies. Consequently, the portfolio manager remains focused on countries with stronger economic fundamentals and continues to adopt a selective approach toward higher-yielding sovereign issuers. That said, there are potential positives on the horizon, including the likelihood that the U.S. will be able to negotiate tariff agreements with China and other countries, as well as continued economic stimulus from rate-cutting across emerging-market nations.

Related-Party Transactions

Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Manager

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada (“Royal Bank”) and is the manager, trustee and portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund’s day-to-day operations, holds title to the Fund’s property on behalf of its unitholders, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM, which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. RBC GAM, as trustee, earns a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when unitholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.



Distributors

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of units of, the Fund. Dealers may receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of units of the Fund.

Registrars

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns units of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Custodian

RBC IS is the custodian and holds the assets of the Fund. RBC IS earns a fee as the custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

Securities Lending Agent

To the extent the Fund may engage in securities lending transactions, RBC IS may act as the Fund's securities lending agent. Any revenue earned on such securities lending is split between the Fund and the securities lending agent.

Other Related-Party Transactions

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

Related-Party Trading Activities

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity, debt securities or mortgages from or sales of equity, debt securities or mortgages to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

Inter-Fund Trading

- (d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the direct expenses charged to the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of the expenses of underlying funds, if any, for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

² The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not applicable to money market funds.

³ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of such costs of underlying funds expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

Effective January 1, 2023, the administration fees for Series O units were reduced to 0.02% from 0.05%. If the changes to the administration fees would have been in effect throughout the financial year ended December 31, 2022, the adjusted MER for each series of the Fund would be: Series O – 0.06%.

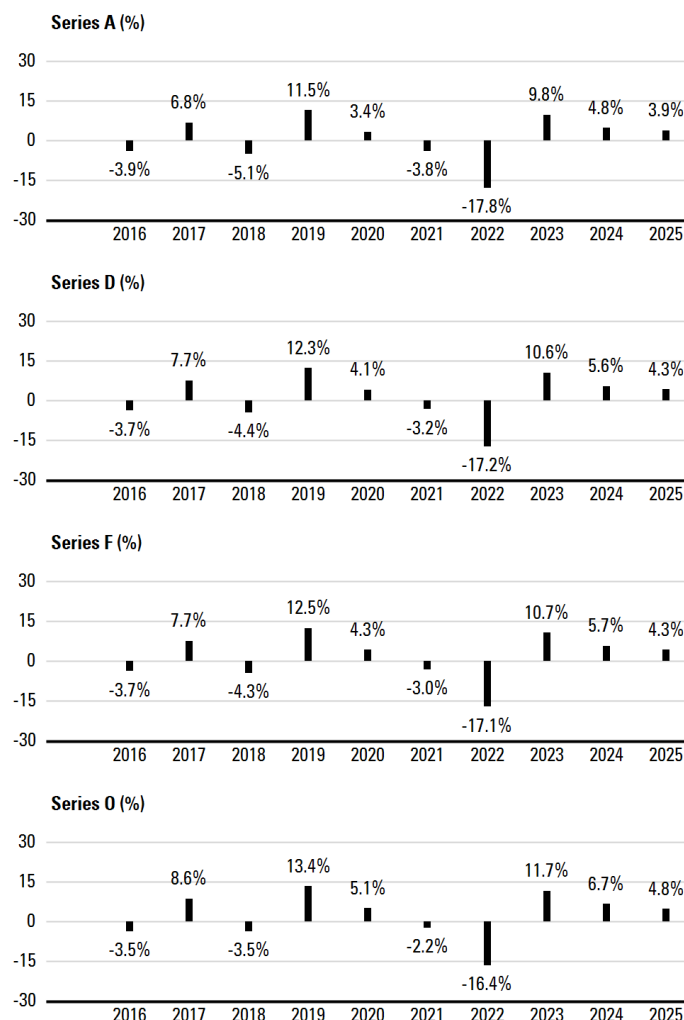
