## MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund pursues long-term capital growth by investing primarily in European stocks. The Fund provides exposure to growth opportunities in the European economy and diversification benefits beyond North America.

The portfolio manager reviews the economic outlook for Europe and then selects stocks based on fundamental, technical and quantitative inputs. The Fund is managed to limit risk by spreading investments across different industries. The Fund may also invest in debt securities issued or guaranteed by European governments and international agencies.

### Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value was \$6.4 billion as of June 30, 2023.

Over the past six months, the Fund's Series F units gained 9.4%. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

European equities recorded gains during the first six months of 2023, as the global economy proved more resilient than expected and initial fears of a severe nationwide recession dissipated. However, inflation remained well above acceptable levels during the period, and the European Central Bank and the Bank of England (the "BOE") continued to raise interest rates in response.

Both central banks boosted rates to the highest levels since before the financial crisis of 2008, and both admitted that they had underestimated how "sticky" inflation would become, with tight labour markets and resilient economic data exacerbating the issue. U.K. inflation was among the highest in the developed world, and a resurgence in inflation prompted the BOE to raise its key rate by 0.50 percentage point in late June.

European equities outperformed most other regions early in the year, finding support from the reopening of the Chinese economy and falls in oil and gas prices. Measured declines in inflation amid signs of economic strength were taken by investors as evidence that interest rates were close to peaking. However, stocks pulled back in March after the collapse of several mid-sized U.S. banks, and related financial instability ultimately resulted in Credit Suisse, a 167-year-old financial institution, being forced to accept a government-arranged takeover by the rival Swiss bank UBS.

The stock markets of Ireland, Italy and Spain were the strongest performers. Finland was Europe's worst-performing stock market, with Norway and Belgium also lagging. At the sector level, Information Technology and Consumer Discretionary were the strongest performers, while Real Estate and Energy were the worst-performing.

The Fund's overweight position in the Financials sector held back portfolio returns the most, while an overweight position in Industrials was the largest contributor to relative returns.

Among individual stocks, LVMH, the luxury-goods company, was the biggest contributor to the Fund's performance, and ASML Holding ranked second. Sampo, an insurance company, held back returns the most.

### Recent Developments

European equities had until recently outperformed most other global equity markets, especially as corporate earnings repeatedly surprised investors. Issues are emerging, however, to challenge this positive trend. Higher-than-expected inflation, especially in the U.K., means that European central banks are likely farther from ending policy tightening than other regions. Moreover, manufacturing has slowed considerably, and tighter access to loans is beginning to hurt companies. The war in Ukraine continues to demand much from the region.

Effective January 1, 2023, Suromitra Sanatani was appointed as Chair of the Independent Review Committee ("the IRC"). Effective February 1, 2023, Joanne Vézina was appointed as a member of the IRC. Effective March 1, 2023, Enrique Cuyegkeng was appointed as a member of the IRC.

### Related-Party Transactions

#### *Manager, Trustee and Portfolio Manager*

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank of Canada ("Royal Bank") and is the manager, trustee and portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund's day-to-day operations, holds title to the Fund's property on behalf of its unitholders, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM, which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. RBC GAM, as trustee, earns a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.



RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when unitholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.

#### ***Sub-Advisor***

RBC Global Asset Management (UK) Limited is the sub-advisor and provides investment advice for the Fund. The sub-advisor earns a fee which is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund. The sub-advisor is paid by the manager from the management fee paid by the Fund.

#### ***Distributors***

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of units of, the Fund. Dealers may receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of units of the Fund.

#### ***Registrars***

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns units of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

#### ***Custodian***

RBC IS is the custodian and holds the assets of the Fund. RBC IS earns a fee as the custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

#### ***Securities Lending Agent***

To the extent the Fund may engage in securities lending transactions, RBC IS may act as the Fund's securities lending agent. Any revenue earned on such securities lending is split between the Fund and the securities lending agent.

#### ***Brokers and Dealers***

The Fund has established standard brokerage and dealing agreements at market rates with related parties. For the periods ended June 30, 2023 and 2022, the related-party commissions were \$92,000 (2022 – \$140,000) or 2% (2022 – 2%) of the total transaction costs paid for this Fund.

#### ***Other Related-Party Transactions***

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

#### ***Related-Party Trading Activities***

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity and debt securities from or sales of equity or debt securities to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

#### ***Inter-Fund Trading***

- (d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

<sup>1</sup> The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the direct expenses charged to the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of the expenses of underlying funds, if any, for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

<sup>2</sup> The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not applicable to money market funds.

<sup>3</sup> The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of such costs of underlying funds expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

Effective March 1, 2020, the administration fees for Series A units were reduced to 0.15% from 0.20%. If the changes to the administration fees would have been in effect throughout the financial year ended December 31, 2020, the adjusted MER for each series of the Fund would be: Series A – 2.10%.

**Management Fees and Administration Fees**

Management fees and administration fees of each series of the Fund are payable to RBC GAM and calculated at the following annual percentages, before GST/HST, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. The management fee, breakdown of services received in consideration of the management fee, as a percentage of the management fee, and the administration fee for each series are as follows:



**PAST PERFORMANCE**

The performance information shown assumes that all distributions made by the Fund in the periods shown were reinvested in additional units of the Fund and would be lower if distributions were not reinvested. 




**Year-by-Year Returns (%)**
