# MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

# **Investment Objective and Strategies**

The Fund seeks to provide investors with a high and sustainable level of income by investing primarily in common shares of dividend-paying Canadian companies. To achieve the Fund's investment objective, the portfolio manager invests in companies that they believe have a superior management team, a leadership position in their industry, a high level of profitability compared to their peers, and the potential for strong earnings and dividend growth.

#### Risk

There were no significant changes to the investment objective and strategies that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the Fund and the suitability of the Fund for investors remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus.

# **Results of Operations**

The Fund's net asset value rose to \$2.4 billion as of December 31, 2024, from \$2.3 billion at the end of 2023. The increase was due to investment returns.

Over the past year, the Fund's Series F units gained 17.5%, which outperformed the 15.7% rise in the benchmark. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while benchmark and broad-based index returns do not include any costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

Canadian equities performed well in 2024, setting records and mirroring strong global stock-market gains. Canada's benchmark, which was led by the Financials and Energy sectors, underperformed the U.S. equivalent due to Canada's relatively low exposure to large-cap technology companies that surged amid optimism about artificial intelligence. Equity-index gains around the world were supported by easing interest rates and investor optimism that inflation has been brought under control.

The Bank of Canada lowered interest rates at a faster pace than the U.S. Federal Reserve in 2024, dropping the Canadian benchmark interest rate to 3.25% from 5% by year-end, in a bid to revive waning domestic economic growth and prevent prices from falling. While shelter costs, reflected in rising mortgage payments and rents, remained the biggest contributor to Canadian inflation, they had moderated by the end of the year given lower interest rates.

The Fund's relative exposure to BCE, Magna International and Brookfield Corp. had the most positive impact on the Fund's returns, while exposure to Rogers Communications, TC Energy and Canadian Apartment Properties REIT was negative for performance.

The sectors that had the most positive impact on the Fund's returns were Consumer Discretionary, Energy and Financials, while exposure to Consumer Staples, Utilities and Industrials had a negative impact.

The Fund had overweight positions in WSP Global, Rogers Communications and Brookfield Infrastructure Partners and underweight positions in BCE, National Bank of Canada and Pembina Pipeline.

At the sector level, the Fund had overweight exposure to Materials, Communication Services and Utilities and underweight exposure to Industrials, Consumer Staples and Consumer Discretionary.

### **Recent Developments**

Many analysts are forecasting a stronger Canadian economy in 2025 driven by improved consumer spending, population growth and business investment at a time when interest rates are falling. At this point a soft landing – a situation where growth slows but the economy does not fall into a recession – seems more likely than not, in the view of the portfolio manager.

# Related-Party Transactions Manager and Portfolio Manager

RBC GAM is an indirect, wholly owned subsidiary of Royal Bank and is the manager and principal portfolio manager of the Fund. RBC GAM is responsible for the Fund's day-to-day operations, provides investment advice and portfolio management services to the Fund and appoints distributors for the Fund. RBC GAM is paid a management fee by the Fund as compensation for its services. The Fund pays a fixed administration fee to RBC GAM, which, in turn, pays certain operating expenses of the Fund. Both the management fee and fixed administration fee are calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of the net asset value of each series of units of the Fund.

RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn fees and spreads in connection with various services provided to, or transactions with, the Fund, such as banking, brokerage, securities lending, foreign exchange and derivatives transactions. RBC GAM or its affiliates may earn a foreign exchange spread when unitholders switch between series of funds denominated in different currencies. The Fund also maintains bank accounts and overdraft provisions with Royal Bank for which Royal Bank may earn a fee. Affiliates of RBC GAM that provide services to the Fund in the course of their normal businesses are discussed below.



#### **Distributors**

RBC GAM, Royal Mutual Funds Inc., RBC Direct Investing Inc., RBC Dominion Securities Inc. and Phillips, Hager & North Investment Funds Ltd. are principal distributors of, or may distribute certain series of units of, the Fund. Dealers may receive an ongoing commission based on the total value of their clients' investment in certain series of units of the Fund.

# Registrars

RBC GAM, RBC Investor Services Trust ("RBC IS") or Royal Bank (or a combination thereof) are the registrars of the Fund and keep records of who owns units of the Fund. The registrars earn a fee, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

### Trustee and Custodian

RBC IS is the trustee and holds title to the Fund's property on behalf of unitholders. RBC IS is the custodian of the Fund and holds the assets of the Fund.

RBC IS earns a fee as the trustee and custodian, which is paid by the manager from the fixed administration fee paid by the Fund.

# **Securities Lending Agent**

To the extent the Fund may engage in securities lending transactions, RBC IS may act as the Fund's securities lending agent. Any revenue earned on such securities lending is split between the Fund and the securities lending agent.

#### **Brokers and Dealers**

The Fund has established standard brokerage and dealing agreements at market rates with related parties. For the periods ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related-party commissions were \$117,000 (2023 -\$4,000) or 15% (2023 -0%) of the total transaction costs paid for this Fund.

### Other Related-Party Transactions

Pursuant to applicable securities legislation, the Fund relied on the standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee with respect to one or more of the following transactions:

Related-Party Trading Activities

- (a) trades in securities of Royal Bank;
- (b) investments in the securities of issuers for which a related-party dealer acted as an underwriter during the distribution of such securities and the 60-day period following the conclusion of such distribution of the underwritten securities to the public;
- (c) purchases of equity, debt securities or mortgages from or sales of equity, debt securities or mortgages to a related-party dealer, where it acted as principal; and

# Inter-Fund Trading

(d) purchases or sales of securities of an issuer from or to another investment fund or managed account managed by RBC GAM.

The applicable standing instructions require that Related-Party Trading Activities and Inter-Fund Trading be conducted in accordance with RBC GAM policy and that RBC GAM advise the Independent Review Committee of a material breach of any standing instruction. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Related-Party Trading Activities (i) is made free from any influence of Royal Bank or its associates or affiliates and without taking into account any consideration relevant to Royal Bank or its affiliates or associates, (ii) represents the business judgment of the portfolio manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund, (iii) is in compliance with RBC GAM policies and procedures, and (iv) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. RBC GAM policy requires that an investment decision in respect of Inter-Fund Trading is in the best interests of each Fund.

RBC GAM may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by RBC GAM of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by RBC GAM.

# **Management Fees and Administration Fees**

Management fees and administration fees of each series of the Fund are payable to RBC GAM and calculated at the following annual percentages, before GST/HST, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. The management fee, breakdown of services received in consideration of the management fee, as a percentage of the management fee, and the administration fee for each series are as follows:

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not applicable to money market funds.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs of the Fund and the Fund's proportionate share of such costs of underlying funds expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. 


# **PAST PERFORMANCE**
